REGULATIONS

**for the Sports Knife Throwing International Competitions among
boys and girls (10-11 years, 12-13 years old, 14-15 years old, 16-17 years old)
"Asian Junior Championship"**

**Mongolia, Darkhan
June 25-30, 2026**

1. GENERAL REGULATIONS

The International Competitions in Sports Knife Throwing among boys and girls (10-11 years old, 12-13 years old, 14-15 years old, 16-17 years old) "Asian Junior Championship" (hereinafter referred to as the Junior Championship) is held in accordance with the Rules of the Sports Knife Throwing, approved by the International Sports Knife Throwing Association (ISKTA).

The Junior Championship is held with the aim of developing the sports knife throwing in the world.

The objectives of the Junior Championship are:

- popularization of the sports knife throwing and expansion of the geography of the participating countries;
- determination of the strongest athletes in the world in sports knife throwing;
- strengthening of international sports relations and exchange of experience between national federations representative offices.

These Regulations is the basis for sending athletes, coaches, referees and other specialists in the field of physical culture and sports to the Junior Championship.

2. DATE AND PLACE

1. Dates: from June 25 to June 30, 2026 (June 25 – day of arrival, June 30 – day of departure).

2. Venue: Mongolia, Darkhan, Darkhan Sports Complex (FWWJ+FJ4, Darkhan-Uul)

3. MANAGEMENT OF THE PREPARATION AND HOLDING OF THE JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIP

General issues of preparation and organization of events related to the Junior Championship: preparation and installation of the venue for the competitions, provision of office equipment, involvement of the media to cover the competitions and other organizational issues are assigned to the organizing committee. The Organizing Committee includes:

- International Sports Knife Throwing Association (ISKTA);
- State Committee for Physical Culture and Sports of Mongolia;
- Mongolian Sports Knife Throwing Federation;
- All-Russian physical culture and sports public organization "Sports Knife Throwing".

The direct holding of the Junior Championship is entrusted to the Main Referee Board.

Judging of the Junior Championship is carried out in accordance with the Rules of the sport "Sports Knife Throwing", approved by the International Sports Knife Throwing Association (ISKTA) (hereinafter referred to as the Rules).

At the end of each day of the Junior Championship, a meeting of the refereeing board and team representatives is held in order to approve the results of the previous day and plans for the next day.

5. TERMS OF COMPETITIONS

Athletes of the following age categories are allowed to participate in the Junior Championship:

- boys and girls (10-11 years old): born 2015 – 2016
- boys and girls (12-13 years old): born 2013 – 2014
- boys and girls (14-15 years old): born 2011 – 2012
- boys and girls (16-17 years old): born 2009 – 2010, including athletes born in 2008 who are under 18 years of age on the day of the admission commission.

Athletes must be able to handle a sports equipment (knife) approved by the Rules, know and strictly follow the Rules of the sport "Sports Knife Throwing" and these Regulations and obtain a doctor's permission to participate in this Junior Championship.

The team consists maximum of 20 boys and 20 girls. Mongolia has the right to field two teams.

Sports equipment approved by the Rules of the sport "Sports Knife Throwing" of the International Sports Knife Throwing Association (ISKTA) is allowed for the Junior Championship.

Participants' uniform: dark sports pants or dark shorts, a T-shirt with the logos of national federations, high-soled sports shoes, it is allowed to use a cap (the same concept as the national team's T-shirt). Athletes are allowed to participate in a white T-shirt.

Referees' uniform: a white short-sleeved shirt, dark pants, dark shoes.

6. DETERMINATION AND AWARDING OF WINNERS

The winners and prize winners in each discipline in the individual competition are determined by the highest number of points scored. In case of equality of points scored, the winner is the one with the highest number of points in the last (penultimate, etc.) series.

The team (first team) of the national federation is competing in the team competition.

The winners and prize winners in the team competition are determined by summing up the results shown by the athletes in the individual competition in the qualifying stage in each sports discipline. If the competition is held in one final stage, the results shown by the athletes in the final stage are summed up.

The composition of the team in the team competition:

- boys 16-17 years old – 1, girls 16-17 years old – 1, boys 14-15 years old – 1, girls 14-15 years old – 1, boys 12-13 years old – 1, girls 12-13 years old – 1, boys 10-11 years old – 1, girls 10-11 years old – 1.



All winners and prize winners in the individual competition are awarded diplomas and medals. In the team competition – cups and diplomas.

Athletes who do not stand on the awards podium, who leave without permission from the Chairman of the Organizing Committee, are deprived of the place they took (cup, medal and diploma).

All national teams must have a national flag, 135x90 cm in size, and the national anthem on an electronic storage medium for the opening, closing and awarding ceremonies.

7. FINANCING CONDITIONS

Travel, accommodation, meals and accreditation of athletes, coaches and representatives at the expense of the sending party.

Expenses related to the Junior Championship – prizes, preparation of the venue, medical care and other logistical support, in accordance with the budget – at the expense of the Organizing Committee, as well as sponsorship and charitable contributions.

8. ORGANIZATIONAL ISSUES

For timely registration of documents, participants of the Junior Championship must confirm their participation no later than May 20, 2026, indicating the passport data (photocopies of foreign passports) of all members of the delegation by e-mail: sports.knife.throwing@gmail.com.

Athletes are admitted to the Junior Championship upon an application signed by the head of the national federation, which is a member of the International Sports Knife Throwing Association (ISKTA) or the head of the ISKTA representative office in country. The application is submitted to the admission commission in one copy during the official registration of participants.

The following documents for each athlete are attached to the application:

- foreign passport (original and copy);
- sports insurance (copy);
- medical insurance policy (copy);
- parental consent for the participation of underage athletes (original).

Responsibility for the safety of athletes lies with accompanying persons.

An athlete who has been disqualified and who has not reported such disqualification to the Admissions Commission bears sole and full responsibility for this action.
